Leith Hill Musical Festival 2018

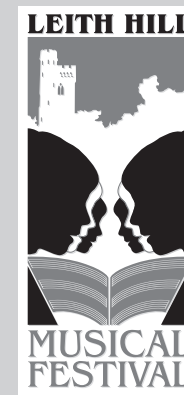
